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Management Discussion of Fund Performance

June 6, 2024

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in the year ended March 31, 2024 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "IGIM" and "the Manager" refer to I.G. Investment Management, Ltd., the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund aims to provide interest income and potential capital growth by investing primarily in bonds and debentures of non-Canadian issuers.

Risk

The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus.

The Fund is suitable for long-term investors looking for income with a growth component who have a low to medium tolerance for risk.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of all series in the current and previous periods is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series. The following comparison to market indices is intended to help investors understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the Fund's mandate may be different from that of the indices shown.

For the year ended March 31, 2024, the Series F securities returned 2.3% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the Fund). In comparison, the ICE BofA Global Broad Market (Hedged) Index returned 2.5%.

The U.S. Federal Reserve, the European Central Bank and the Bank of England raised interest rates early in the period in response to elevated inflation. After July 2023, the Federal Reserve kept the federal funds rate at a target range of 5.25%–5.50%. Treasury yields reached peak levels and then fell in response to the policy shift. The Bank of Japan raised its policy rate for the first time in 17 years, but many central banks signalled potential rate cuts for 2024.

The Fund performed in line with the index, with holdings in foreign government bonds and overweight exposure to corporate bonds in the energy sector contributing to performance. Holdings in corporate bonds in the real estate and industrials sectors detracted from performance, as did the Fund's currency management.

The Fund held positions in selected government bond futures to manage duration (sensitivity to interest rates), which contributed to performance.

Over the period, the portfolio management team increased exposure to higher-yielding foreign government bonds, while decreasing exposure to corporate bonds, to reduce risk and capture a capital gain opportunity.

Net Assets

The Fund's net assets increased by 8.4% during the period to \$37.8 million. This change was composed primarily of \$0.6 million in net income (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and an increase of \$2.4 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

Fees and Expenses

The management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the year ended March 31, 2024, was generally similar to the MER for the year ended March 31, 2023. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. The MERs for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

Recent Developments

The portfolio management team believes that robust economic data and elevated inflation at period-end have diminished earlier market expectations for Federal Reserve policy easing, and the team has a neutral view on duration in the United States. Given weakening economic indicators and restrictive financial conditions, which may lead to more accommodative monetary policy, the team favours duration in Canada. The team expects opportunities to increase the Fund's Canadian duration during selloffs when market pricing underestimates policy rate reductions. In emerging markets, the team believes local currency bonds remain attractive for both high coupons and capital appreciation.

Other Developments

Effective May 3, 2024, Series A was redesignated as Series B; and effective May 10, 2024, Series J DSC was redesignated as Series J NL.

Related Party Transactions

I.G. Investment Management, Ltd. is the Manager, Trustee and Portfolio Advisor of the Fund. The Fund is offered through the Consultants of Investors Group Financial Services Inc. and Investors Group Securities Inc., together referred to as the Distributors. The Manager, Portfolio Advisor, Distributors and Trustee are, indirectly, wholly owned subsidiaries of IGM Financial Inc.

The following sub-advisor provided investment services to the Fund:

- Mackenzie Financial Corporation

Mackenzie Financial Corporation is a wholly owned subsidiary of IGM Financial Inc.

The Fund paid a management fee to the Manager and Portfolio Advisor for management and portfolio advisory services (see *Management Fees*).

The Fund also paid the Manager an administration fee and in exchange the Manager paid the operating costs and expenses of the Fund, except for certain specified costs.

The Trustee is responsible for the overall direction of the affairs of the Fund. The Fund paid the Trustee a fee for its services.

See *Fund Formation and Series Information* for the annual rates paid by each series (as a percentage of average net assets) for these fees.

Securityholders in Series F also pay an advisory fee directly to the Distributors. This fee is not included in the Fund's expenses.

During the period, the Fund invested in other funds also managed by the Manager or affiliates of the Manager. At March 31, 2024, the Fund had \$1.6 million (4.2% of the Fund's NAV) invested in underlying funds managed by Mackenzie. The Manager relied on standing instructions approved by the IG Wealth Management Funds Independent Review Committee for the execution of all such transactions.

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Investment, if any, in unlisted open-ended funds managed by the Manager and/or affiliates of the Manager will be in series that do not pay fees. The exchange-traded funds (ETFs) into which the Fund may invest may have their own fees and expenses which reduce the value of the ETF. Generally, the Manager has determined that fees paid by an ETF are not duplicative with the fees paid by the Fund. However, where the ETF is managed by Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the ETF may distribute a fee rebate to the Fund to offset fees paid within the ETF.

During the period, the Fund received \$0.01 million in income distributions from investments in ETFs managed by the sub-advisor to offset fees paid within the ETFs. There is no assurance that these distributions will continue in the future.

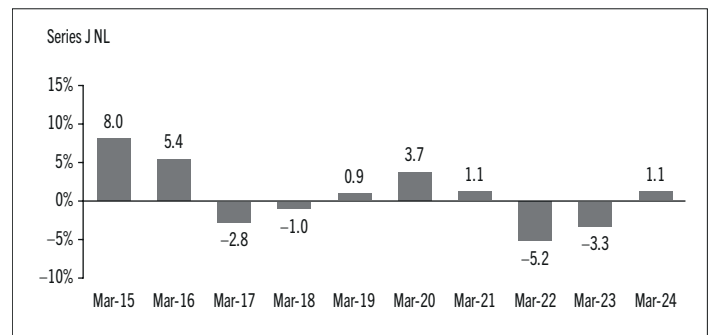
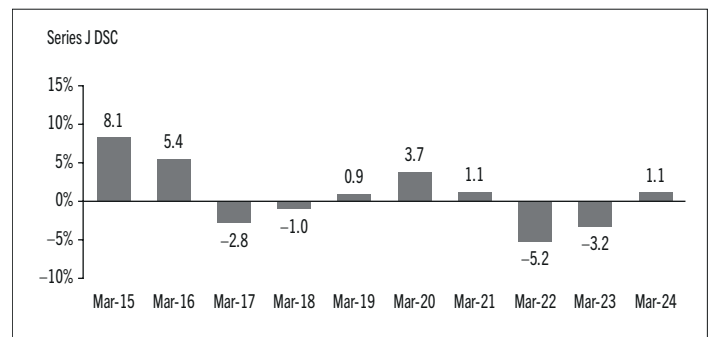
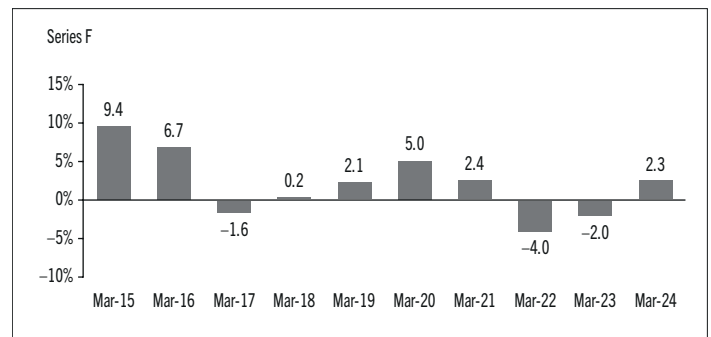
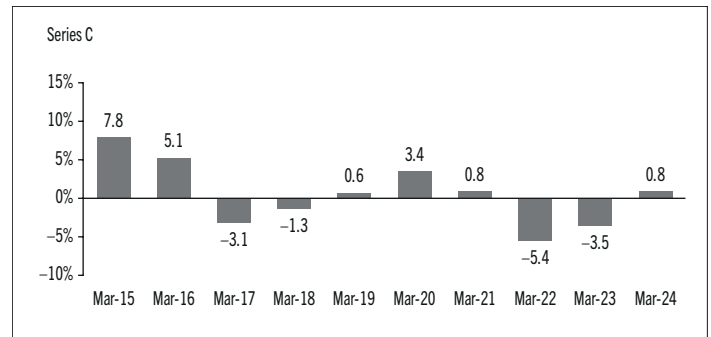
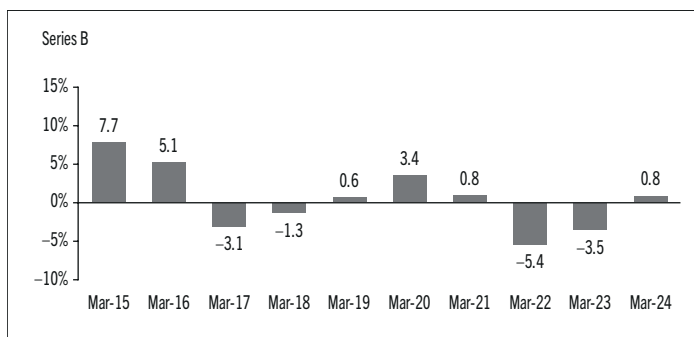
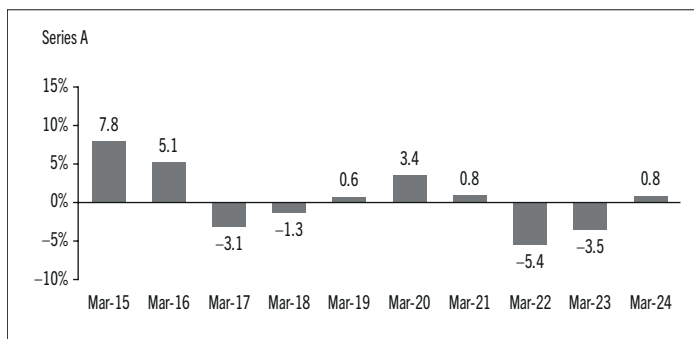
Past Performance

The Fund's performance information assumes all distributions made by the Fund in the periods presented are reinvested in additional securities of the relevant series of the Fund. The performance information does not take into account sales, redemption, distribution or other optional charges, or income taxes payable by any investor that would have reduced returns or performance. The past performance of the Fund is not necessarily an indication of how it will perform in the future.

If you hold this Fund outside of a registered plan, income and capital gains distributions paid to you increase your income for tax purposes whether paid to you in cash or reinvested in additional securities of the Fund. Qualifying bonds must be rated "BBB" or higher and have a remaining term to maturity of at least one year. The foreign currency exposure is hedged to the Canadian dollar.

Management Fees

The Fund pays a management fee, and this fee, paid by each series, is calculated as a percentage of the net asset value of the series at the close of each business day (see *Fund Formation and Series Information* for rates payable by each series). Generally, management fees pay the costs incurred to provide investment advisory and management services, as well as distribution-related services provided by the Distributors.

However, in the case of Series F, securityholders pay the Distributor an advisory fee (separate from the management fee) directly. Therefore, the management fee in that series is used for investment advisory and management services only.

For all other retail series (i.e. those that exclude Series R, P and S, if issued), approximately 47% of management fees paid during the period was used for investment advisory and management services, and approximately 53% related to distribution-related services. This may vary by series.
