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Management Discussion of Fund Performance

June 6, 2024

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in the year ended March 31, 2024 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "IGIM" and "the Manager" refer to I.G. Investment Management, Ltd., the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks income with the potential for long-term capital growth by investing primarily in fixed income investments and/or securities that pay dividends or other income. The Fund will pursue a flexible approach to investing in fixed income and/or dividends or other income asset classes anywhere in the world. Currently, it invests primarily in North America.

Risk

The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus.

The Fund is suitable for long-term investors looking for income with a growth component who have a low to medium tolerance for risk.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of all series in the current and previous periods is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series. The following comparison to market indices is intended to help investors understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the Fund's mandate may be different from that of the indices shown.

For the year ended March 31, 2024, the Series F securities returned 10.7% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the Fund). In comparison, the S&P/TSX Composite Index (equity index) returned 14.0% and the FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index (fixed income index) returned 2.1%.

Canadian equities demonstrated resilience and positive momentum over the period, supported by the energy sector. The Bank of Canada paused interest rate increases after July 2023, holding its policy rate at 5.00%. Treasury yields reached peak levels and then fell in response to the policy shift. Flat consumer activity negatively affected economic growth, while wage growth moderated and inflation decreased significantly. The Bank of Canada continued to express concerns about inflation but signalled a possible policy rate cut later in 2024.

Within the S&P/TSX Composite Index, information technology, health care and energy were the strongest sectors, while communication services, utilities and materials were the weakest.

The equity portion of the Fund outperformed the equity index, with an underweight position and stock selection in the materials sector and stock selection in the communication services sector contributing to performance. Holdings in the

United States and Denmark also contributed to performance. Stock selection in the consumer staples and industrials sectors detracted from performance, as did holdings in Switzerland.

The fixed income portion of the Fund outperformed the fixed income index, with an overweight position and security selection in corporate bonds, particularly in the energy and industrials sectors, contributing to performance. Within corporate bonds, holdings in the real estate sector detracted from performance.

Net Assets

The Fund's net assets increased by 10.1% during the period to \$232.0 million. This change was composed primarily of \$21.8 million in net income (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and a decrease of \$0.5 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

Fees and Expenses

The management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the year ended March 31, 2024, was generally similar to the MER for the year ended March 31, 2023. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. The MERs for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

Recent Developments

From a Canadian equity perspective, the portfolio management team believes the rally in equity markets that began late in 2023 has reflected a degree of investor optimism about an economic "soft landing" rather than a recession, as well as a lower interest rate environment. However, the team expects market volatility to persist in response to an uncertain economic outlook. The team remains cautiously optimistic about the long-term prospects for equities and opportunistically makes changes to the portfolio as ongoing volatility affects the risk-reward profiles of sectors and stocks.

From a global equity perspective, the team believes that, in periods of elevated volatility, it is most important to focus on what can be controlled. In response to higher levels of inflation and market volatility, the team continued to identify holdings for the portfolio in a diversified collection of companies that have the ability to raise prices without reducing demand for their products and/or that have business models with a competitive advantage.

From a fixed income perspective, the team believes that while policy interest rates in Canada have peaked, the Bank of Canada's actions will be data dependent and the path for interest rates will be uneven. Given weakening economic indicators and restrictive financial conditions, which may lead to more accommodative monetary policy, the team favours duration (sensitivity to interest rates) in Canada. The team expects opportunities to increase the portfolio's duration during selloffs when market pricing underestimates policy rate reductions.

Other Developments

Effective May 3, 2024, Series A was redesignated as Series B; and effective May 10, 2024, Series J DSC, Series T DSC and Series T JDSC were redesignated as Series J NL, Series T NL and Series T JNL, respectively.

Related Party Transactions

I.G. Investment Management, Ltd. is the Manager, Trustee and Portfolio Advisor of the Fund. The Fund is offered through the Consultants of Investors Group Financial Services Inc. and Investors Group Securities Inc., together referred to as the Distributors. The Manager, Portfolio Advisor, Distributors and Trustee are, indirectly, wholly owned subsidiaries of IGM Financial Inc.

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The following sub-advisor provided investment services to the Fund:

- Mackenzie Financial Corporation

Mackenzie Financial Corporation is a wholly owned subsidiary of IGM Financial Inc.

The Fund paid a management fee to the Manager and Portfolio Advisor for management and portfolio advisory services (see *Management Fees*).

The Fund also paid the Manager an administration fee and in exchange the Manager paid the operating costs and expenses of the Fund, except for certain specified costs.

The Fund paid the Distributors a service fee as compensation for providing or arranging for the provision of services to the Fund, including the issue or allotment of securities. A portion of the service fee for Series C and Tc is rebated by the Distributors to the Fund, for distribution to Series C and Tc securityholders quarterly, as outlined in the Prospectus.

The Trustee is responsible for the overall direction of the affairs of the Fund. The Fund paid the Trustee a fee for its services.

See *Fund Formation and Series Information* for the annual rates paid by each series (as a percentage of average net assets) for these fees.

Securityholders in Series F and Series FT also pay an advisory fee directly to the Distributors. This fee is not included in the Fund's expenses.

During the period, the Fund invested in other funds also managed by the Manager or affiliates of the Manager. At March 31, 2024, the Fund had \$9.9 million (4.3% of the Fund's NAV) invested in underlying funds managed by Mackenzie. The Manager relied on standing instructions approved by the IG Wealth Management Funds Independent Review Committee for the execution of all such transactions.

Investment, if any, in unlisted open-ended funds managed by the Manager and/or affiliates of the Manager will be in series that do not pay fees. The exchange-traded funds (ETFs) into which the Fund may invest may have their own fees and expenses which reduce the value of the ETF. Generally, the Manager has determined that fees paid by an ETF are not duplicative with the fees paid by the Fund. However, where the ETF is managed by Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the ETF may distribute a fee rebate to the Fund to offset fees paid within the ETF.

During the period, the Fund received \$0.05 million in income distributions from investments in ETFs managed by the sub-advisor to offset fees paid within the ETFs. There is no assurance that these distributions will continue in the future.

IGM Financial Inc. is a subsidiary of Power Corporation of Canada. Companies related to Power Corporation of Canada are therefore considered affiliates of the Manager. As at March 31, 2024, the Fund held the following investments in companies affiliated with the Manager: common shares of Power Corporation of Canada valued at \$0.9 million and common shares of Pernod Ricard SA valued at \$0.3 million. The Manager relied on the standing instructions approved by the IG Wealth Management Funds Independent Review Committee for investment in related issuers. These investments represented, in aggregate, 0.5% of the Fund's net assets.



Past Performance

The Fund's performance information assumes all distributions made by the Fund in the periods presented are reinvested in additional securities of the relevant series of the Fund. 







Year-by-Year Returns



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Annual Compound Returns

Management Fees

The Fund pays a management fee, and this fee, paid by each series, is calculated as a percentage of the net asset value of the series at the close of each business day (see *Fund Formation and Series Information* for rates payable by each series). Generally, management fees pay the costs incurred to provide investment advisory and management services, as well as distribution-related services provided by the Distributors.

However, in the case of Series F and FT, securityholders pay the Distributors an advisory fee (separate from the management fee) directly. Therefore, the management fee in those series is used for investment advisory and management services only.

For all other retail series (i.e. those that exclude Series R, P and S, if issued), approximately 62% of management fees paid during the period was used for investment advisory and management services, and approximately 38% related to distribution-related services. This may vary by series.
