## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

### June 2, 2022

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in the year ended March 31, 2022 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "IGIM" and "the Manager" refer to I.G. Investment Management, Ltd., the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

## Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund aims to provide long-term capital growth by investing primarily in the common shares of corporations around the world involved in natural resource industries or who provide goods and services to these industries.

## **R**isk

The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus.

The Fund is suitable for long-term investors looking for capital growth who intend to hold the Fund as one component of a diversified investment portfolio and who have a high tolerance for risk.

## **Results of Operations**

### **Investment Performance**

In accordance with National Instrument 81-106, the following comparison to one or more market indices has been included to help you understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the portfolio management team cautions that the Fund's mandate may be different from the index or indices shown. For a description of the index or indices, see *Annual Compound Returns*. Also, it is important to note that investors cannot invest in an index. Indirect investments in an index are available; however, there are fees and transaction costs and other variables that will impact returns when investing in these products. Index returns included in the comparison below do not reflect these costs and variables. In addition, unlike the index, this Fund may be subject to valuation adjustments as outlined in the Fund's valuation policies as it relates to non-North American equities held either directly or indirectly by the Fund. A fair value adjustment can either positively or negatively impact the Fund's rate of return.

For the returns of all series and for longer-term performance of the Fund, see the *Past Performance* section of this report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses may differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. See *Series Information* for the annual expense rates for each series.

For the year ended March 31, 2022, the Series U securities returned 54.8% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the Fund). In comparison, the Fund's broadbased index, the MSCI World (Net) Index, returned 9.5% and the Fund's blended index returned 32.9%. The blended index is composed of a 55% weighting in the MSCI World Energy (Net) Index (returned 49.5%) and a 45% weighting in the MSCI World Materials (Net) Index (returned 12.4%). Given the Fund's mandate, the blended index has been included as a more meaningful comparison.

Global markets generally rose but were volatile over the period. Lockdowns related to new COVID-19 variants caused chaotic economic reopening as semiconductor, commodity and labour shortages negatively affected supply chains. Russia's

invasion of Ukraine disrupted energy markets, particularly in the eurozone. Several advanced economies had annual inflation above 5%, the highest in more than two decades. The period ended with a massive investor rotation out of growth stocks, which are relatively sensitive to interest rates, and into lower-priced value stocks.

Within the MSCI World (Net) Index, Norway, Canada and Denmark were the strongest-performing markets in Canadian dollar terms, while Ireland, New Zealand and Hong Kong were the weakest. The energy, information technology and real estate sectors were the strongest performers, while communication services, industrials and consumer discretionary were the weakest.

Most commodities ended the period with significant price increases. After years of underinvestment in resource industries, supply could not satisfy the increased demand resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic recovery. Oil prices rose and then surpassed U.S.\$120 per barrel after Russia invaded Ukraine in February 2022. North America and Europe weighed the possibility of refusing to purchase Russian oil and gas against the likelihood of Russia cutting supplies to Europe.

The Fund outperformed the broad-based index because of its focus on the energy and materials sectors, which outperformed the broader market.

The Fund outperformed the blended index, with stock selection in Canada and lack of exposure to Japan contributing to performance. In industry terms, stock selection in oil, gas and consumable fuels and in metals and mining contributed to performance, as did underweight exposure to chemicals.

Conversely, underweight exposure to the United States and the United Kingdom detracted from performance. In industry terms, overweight exposure to paper and forest products and stock selection in energy equipment and services detracted from performance. The Fund's cash position also detracted from performance as equity markets rose.

### **Net Assets**

The Fund's net assets increased by 42.6% during the period to \$91.8 million. This change was composed primarily of \$31.7 million in net income (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and a decrease of \$4.3 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

### **Fees and Expenses**

The management expense ratio (MER) for each series during the year ended March 31, 2022, was generally similar to the MER for the year ended March 31, 2021. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. The MERs for Series A and Series J DSC decreased due to changes in their average net assets. The MERs for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

## **Recent Developments**

While the portfolio management team expects commodity prices to fall from peak levels, the team expects them to remain well above the lows reached in previous cycles. Supply has been unable to catch up with accelerating demand due to pandemic-related and geopolitical disruptions. Further, weak prices during the last decade forced producers to restrain capital investment, which is structurally affecting today's supplies.

While China was the main driver for commodity demand in the early 2000s, the team believes the next decade will be about infrastructure and climate action. This shift should allow prices to stabilize at higher levels than expected by current market consensus. The team believes commodity prices need to rise to encourage resource companies to help meet society's environmental aspirations. Higher prices should be reflected in higher earnings multiples – which the team views as the ultimate signal for company executives to redeploy capital and address climate change.

### **Other Developments**

Ongoing uncertainty regarding the duration and long-term impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and the effectiveness of vaccines against new variants of the virus contributes to uncertainty regarding the timing of a full economic recovery. As a result, it is not possible to reliably estimate the impact of the pandemic on the financial results and condition of the Fund in future periods.

Effective September 14, 2021, Wendy Rudd was appointed as a member of the IG Wealth Management Funds' Independent Review Committee.

### **Related Party Transactions**

I.G. Investment Management, Ltd. is the Manager and Portfolio Advisor of the Fund. The Fund is offered through the Consultants of Investors Group Financial Services Inc. and Investors Group Securities Inc., together referred to as the Distributors. The Manager, Portfolio Advisor and Distributors are, indirectly, wholly owned subsidiaries of IGM Financial Inc.

The following sub-advisor provided investment services to the Fund:

• Mackenzie Financial Corporation

Mackenzie Financial Corporation is a wholly owned subsidiary of IGM Financial Inc.

The Fund paid a management fee to the Manager and Portfolio Advisor for management and portfolio advisory services (see *Management Fees*).

The Fund also paid the Manager an administration fee and in exchange the Manager paid the operating costs and expenses of the Fund, except for certain specified costs.

The Fund paid the Distributors a service fee as compensation for providing or arranging for the provision of services to the Fund, including the issue or allotment of securities.

See *Series Information* for the annual rates paid by each series (as a percentage of average net assets) for these fees.

Securityholders in Series U also pay an advisory fee directly to the Distributors. This fee is not included in the Fund's expenses.

During the period, the Fund invested in other funds also managed by the Manager or affiliates of the Manager. The Manager relied on standing instructions approved by the IG Wealth Management Funds Independent Review Committee for the execution of all such transactions.

Investment, if any, in unlisted open-ended funds managed by the Manager and/or affiliates of the Manager will be in series that do not pay fees. The exchange-traded funds (ETFs) into which the Fund may invest may have their own fees and expenses which reduce the value of the ETF. Generally, the Manager has determined that fees paid by an ETF are not duplicative with the fees paid by the Fund. However, where the ETF is managed by Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the ETF may distribute a fee rebate to the Fund to offset fees paid within the ETF.

# **Past Performance**

The Fund's past performance information is presented in the following charts and table. It assumes all distributions made by the Fund in the periods presented are reinvested in additional securities of the relevant series of the Fund. The charts and table do not take into account sales, redemption, distribution or optional charges, or income taxes payable by any investor that would have reduced returns. The past performance of the Fund is not necessarily an indication of how it will perform in the future.

If you hold this Fund outside of a registered plan, income and capital gains distributions paid to you increase your income for tax purposes whether paid to you in cash or reinvested in additional securities of the Fund. The amount of reinvested taxable distributions is added to the adjusted cost base of the securities that you




Performance during these periods may have been impacted by the following events:

- Effective June 30, 2012, the annual management fee rate for Series A and B decreased by 0.10% to 2.00%.
- Effective June 30, 2012, the annual service fee rate for Series B decreased by 0.05% to 0.40%.
- Effective January 1, 2017, the annual management fee rate for Series U decreased by 0.10% to 0.90%.
- Effective January 1, 2017, the annual service fee rate for Series B and J NL decreased by 0.10% to 0.30%.
- Effective August 28, 2020, the annual management fee rate for Series A and B decreased by 0.15% to 1.85%, for Series J DSC and J NL the rate decreased by 0.15% to 1.60% and for Series U the rate decreased by 0.15% to 0.75%.








Where the Fund directly invests in securities of another fund (including exchange-traded funds or ETFs), the MERs presented for the Fund include the portion of MERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment. Any income distributions received from ETFs managed by affiliates of the Manager, with the intention of offsetting fees paid within those ETFs but which are not considered to be duplicative fees under regulatory requirements, are treated as waived expenses for MER purposes. The Manager may waive or absorb operating expenses at its discretion and stop waiving or absorbing such expenses at any time without notice.
- (3) The trading expense ratio ("TER") represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs incurred as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period. Where the Fund invests in securities of another fund (including exchange-traded funds or ETFs), the TERs presented for the Fund include the portion of TERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment.
- (4) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund. The portfolio turnover rate is not provided when the Fund is less than one year old. The value of any trades to realign the Fund's portfolio after a fund merger, if any, is excluded from the portfolio turnover rate.

## **Management Fees**

The Fund pays a management fee, and this fee, paid by each series, is calculated as a percentage of the net asset value of the series at the close of each business day (see *Series Information* for rates payable by each series). Generally, management fees pay the costs incurred to provide investment advisory and management services, as well as distribution-related services provided by the Distributors.

However, in the case of Series U, securityholders pay the Distributor an advisory fee (separate from the management fee) directly. Therefore, the management fee in that series is used for investment advisory and management services only.

For all other retail series (i.e., those that exclude Series R, P and S, if issued), approximately 66% of management fees paid during the period was used for investment advisory and management services, and approximately 34% related to distribution-related services. This may vary by series.
