Management Discussion of Fund Performance

NOVEMBER 12, 2021

This management discussion of Fund performance presents views of the portfolio management team about the significant factors and developments during the past six months that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook since March 31, 2021, the Fund's most recent fiscal year-end. This report should be read in conjunction with the annual Management Report of Fund Performance for the year ended March 31, 2021.

Results of Operations

CHANGES IN NET ASSETS

The Fund's net assets decreased by 2.2% during the period to \$256.0 million. This change was comprised primarily of gains from operations of \$14.7 million and a decrease of \$20.5 million due to net securityholder activity.

FEES AND EXPENSES

The management expense ratios (MERs) are lower than the MERs for the 12-month period ended March 31, 2021 primarily due to reductions in fee rates (see *Series Information*). Total expenses paid also vary period to period as a result of changes in average assets in each series.

INVESTMENT PERFORMANCE

In accordance with National Instrument 81-106, the following comparison to one or more market indices has been included to help you understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the portfolio management team cautions that the Fund's mandate may be different from the index or indices shown. Also, it is important to note that investors cannot invest in an index. Indirect investments in an index are available; however, there are fees and transaction costs and other variables that will impact returns when investing in these products. Index returns included in the comparison below do not reflect these costs and variables.

For the returns of all series and for longer-term performance of the Fund, see the *Past Performance* section of this report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses may differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. See *Series Information* for the annual expense rates for each series.

For the six-month period ended September 30, 2021, the Series U securities returned 6.1% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the Fund). In comparison, the S&P/TSX Composite Index returned 8.7%.

Canadian equities continued their upward momentum over the period, reaching new highs as ongoing COVID-19 vaccination programs and broader use of health and safety protocols facilitated further economic reopening. Significant government and central bank stimulus, both globally and in Canada, continued to underpin economic growth and equity valuations. The combination of economic reopening and tight supply supported a strong rise in oil prices, benefiting the Canadian energy sector.

Within the S&P/TSX Composite Index, information technology, energy and real estate were the strongest sectors, while health care, consumer discretionary and materials were the weakest.

The Fund underperformed the index, with underweight exposure to the energy sector and stock selection in the communication services sector detracting from performance. An underweight position and stock selection in the health care sector and stock selection in the consumer discretionary sector contributed to performance.

Recent Developments

The portfolio management team believes that Canada is likely to experience continued economic growth into 2022, given current and expected levels of stimulus and a progressive reopening of the economy due to high vaccination rates. In the team's opinion, a shift into value-oriented sectors, such as financials and energy, has benefited the Canadian market. As long as growth meets expectations following a gradual global economic reopening, the team is optimistic about the outlook for these sectors sensitive to the economic cycle and for the Canadian market more broadly. The team aims to base its evaluation of fair value for potential holdings on fundamental earnings drivers.

Other Developments

Ongoing uncertainty regarding the duration and long-term impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and the implementation of vaccination programs, as well as the efficacy of government and central bank monetary and fiscal interventions, may continue to affect the Fund's performance in future periods.

Effective June 28, 2021, the annual management fee rate for Series A, B, C, J DSC, J NL and U decreased by 0.05%.

Effective September 14, 2021, Wendy Rudd was appointed as a member of the IG Wealth Management Funds' Independent Review Committee.

Related Party Transactions

I.G. Investment Management, Ltd. is the Manager, Trustee and Portfolio Advisor of the Fund. The Fund is offered through the Consultants of Investors Group Financial Services Inc. and Investors Group Securities Inc., together referred to as the Distributors. The Manager, Portfolio Advisor, Distributors and Trustee are, indirectly, wholly owned subsidiaries of IGM Financial Inc.

The following sub-advisor provided investment services to the Fund:

• Mackenzie Financial Corporation

Mackenzie Financial Corporation is a wholly owned subsidiary of IGM Financial Inc.

The Fund paid a management fee to the Manager and Portfolio Advisor for management and portfolio advisory services (see *Management Fees*).

The Fund also paid the Manager an administration fee and in exchange the Manager paid the operating costs and expenses of the Fund, except for certain specified costs.

The Fund paid the Distributors a service fee as compensation for providing or arranging for the provision of services to the Fund, including the issue or allotment of securities. A portion of the service fee for Series C is rebated by the Distributors to the Fund, for distribution to Series C securityholders quarterly, as outlined in the Prospectus.

The Trustee is responsible for the overall direction of the affairs of the Fund. The Fund paid the Trustee a fee for its services.

See Series Information for the annual rates paid by each series (as a percent of average net assets) for these fees.

Securityholders in Series U also pay an advisory fee directly to the Distributors. This fee is not included in the Fund's expenses.

During the period, the Fund invested in other funds also managed by the Manager or affiliates of the Manager. The Manager relied on standing instructions approved by the IG Wealth Management Funds Independent Review Committee for the execution of all such transactions.

Investment, if any, in unlisted open-ended funds managed by the Manager and/or affiliates of the Manager will be in series that do not pay fees. The exchange-traded funds (ETFs) into which the Fund may invest may have their own fees and expenses which reduce the value of the ETF. Generally, the Manager has determined that fees paid by an ETF are not duplicative with the fees paid by the Fund. However, where the ETF is managed by Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the ETF may distribute a fee rebate to the Fund to offset fees paid within the ETF.

During the period, the Fund received \$4,848 in income distributions from investments in ETFs managed by the sub-advisor to offset fees paid within the ETFs. There is no assurance that these distributions will continue in the future.

IGM Financial Inc. is a subsidiary of Power Corporation of Canada. Companies related to Power Corporation of Canada are therefore considered affiliates of the Manager. As at September 30, 2021, the Fund held the following investments in companies affiliated with the Manager: common shares of Power Corporation of Canada valued at \$4,714,201. The Manager relied on the standing instructions approved by the IG Wealth Management Funds Independent Review Committee for investment in related issuers. This investment represented 1.8% of the Fund's net assets.

Certain other investment funds, distributed by IG Wealth Management, and other qualified investors may invest in Series P of this Fund. As at September 30, 2021, this series comprised approximately 11.3% of the Fund's net assets. The Manager relied on standing instructions approved by the IG Wealth Management Funds Independent Review Committee for the execution of all such transactions, which are based on the net asset value per security determined in accordance with the stated policies of the Fund on each transaction day. Investments by other investment funds in the Fund increase the risk of large redemption or purchase orders, which could result in larger than normal cash positions in the Fund for short periods of time. This could have an impact on the Fund's operations. However, the Manager uses various strategies to minimize the potential dilutive impact associated with large cash positions. These strategies may include transferring securities in-kind where possible, utilizing ETFs to maintain market exposure in lieu of cash and spreading transactions in smaller increments over a period of

Management Fees

The Fund pays a management fee, and this fee, paid by each series, is calculated as a percentage of the net asset value of the series at the close of each business day (see *Series Information* for rates payable by each series). Generally, management fees pay the costs incurred to provide investment advisory and management services, as well as distribution-related services provided by the Distributors.

However, in the case of Series U, securityholders pay the Distributor an advisory fee (separate from the management fee) directly. Therefore, the management fee in that series is used for investment advisory and management services only.

For all other retail series (i.e. which excludes Series R, P and S, if issued), approximately 60% of management fees paid during the period was used for investment advisory and management services, and approximately 40% related to distribution-related services. This may vary by series.




Performance during these periods may have been impacted by the following events:


- Effective June 30, 2012, the annual management fee rate for Series A and B decreased by 0.15% to 1.85%.
- Effective June 30, 2012, the annual service fee rate for Series B decreased by 0.05% to 0.40%.
- Effective January 1, 2017, the annual management fee rate for Series U decreased by 0.10% to 0.75%.
- Effective January 1, 2017, the annual service fee rate for Series B and J NL decreased by 0.10% to 0.30%.
- Effective August 28, 2020, the annual management fee rate for Series A and B decreased by 0.10% to 1.75%, for Series C the rate decreased by 0.10% to 1.90%, for Series J DSC and J NL the rate decreased by 0.10% to 1.50% and for Series U the rate decreased by 0.10% to 0.65%.
- Effective June 28, 2021, the annual management fee rate for Series A and B decreased by 0.05% to 1.70%, for Series C the rate decreased by 0.05% to 1.85%, for Series J DSC and J NL the rate decreased by 0.05% to 1.45% and for Series U the rate decreased by 0.05% to 0.60%.


Year-by-Year Returns







