Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 14, 2022

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in the six-month period ended September 30, 2022 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "IGIM" and "the Manager" refer to I.G. Investment Management, Ltd., the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

In accordance with National Instrument 81-106, the following comparison to one or more market indices has been included to help you understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the portfolio management team cautions that the Fund's mandate may be different from the index or indices shown. Also, it is important to note that investors cannot invest in an index. Indirect investments in an index are available; however, there are fees and transaction costs and other variables that will impact returns when investing in these products. Index returns included in the comparison below do not reflect these costs and variables.

For the returns of all series and for longer-term performance of the Fund, see the *Past Performance* section of this report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses may differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. See *Series Information* for the annual expense rates for each series.

For the six-month period ended September 30, 2022, the Series F (formerly Series U) securities returned -16.6% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the Fund). In comparison, the S&P 500 Index returned -11.7%.

Persistent inflation, rising interest rates and higher energy costs were the prevailing investment themes over the period. Despite a strong rebound in U.S. equity markets during the summer, market indices fell to new lows in September as the U.S. Federal Reserve set the stage for further increases in its federal funds rate. Moderating indicators of U.S. economic growth also put downward pressure on markets. The strong U.S. dollar mitigated losses in Canadian dollar terms.

Within the S&P 500 Index, energy, utilities and health care were the strongest sectors in Canadian dollar terms, while communication services, information technology and real estate were the weakest.

As at September 30, 2022, substantially all the net assets of the Fund were invested in IG Putnam U.S. Growth Fund (the Underlying Fund).

The Underlying Fund underperformed the index. Stock selection in the health care sector and overweight exposure to the information technology sector detracted from performance, while stock selection in the real estate sector contributed to performance.

Net Assets

The Fund's net assets decreased by 17.5% during the period to \$390.5 million. This change was composed primarily of \$78.8 million in net losses (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and a decrease of \$3.8 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the period ended September 30, 2022, was generally similar to the MER for the year ended March 31, 2022. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. The MERs for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

Recent Developments

U.S. companies were challenged over the period by rising interest rates as the Federal Reserve attempted to tame inflation. Financial conditions tightened dramatically, resulting in higher borrowing costs. Although overall corporate earnings have been resilient, they were buoyed by stronger-than-expected results from energy companies.

The portfolio management team of the Underlying Fund expects that some businesses will not be able to adequately cope with high inflation, supply chain disruptions, earnings challenges and economic headwinds. The team believes that growth-oriented companies with the power to adjust prices will be able to largely offset cost pressures, including rising labour and freight costs. Short-term sell-offs in growth stocks create opportunities for the team to build positions in companies favoured by the Underlying Fund, including high-quality businesses with strong long-term growth potential.

Related Party Transactions

I.G. Investment Management, Ltd. is the Manager and Portfolio Advisor of the Fund. The Fund is offered through the Consultants of Investors Group Financial Services Inc. and Investors Group Securities Inc., together referred to as the Distributors. The Manager, Portfolio Advisor and Distributors are, indirectly, wholly owned subsidiaries of IGM Financial Inc.

The following sub-advisor provided investment services to the Underlying Fund:

- Putnam Investments Canada ULC, operating as Putnam Management in Manitoba, and its affiliate, The Putnam Advisory Company, LLC

Putnam Investments Canada ULC and The Putnam Advisory Company, LLC are indirectly affiliated with IGM Financial Inc.

The Fund paid a management fee to the Manager and Portfolio Advisor for management and portfolio advisory services (see *Management Fees*).

The Fund also paid the Manager an administration fee and in exchange the Manager paid the operating costs and expenses of the Fund, except for certain specified costs.

The Fund paid the Distributors a service fee as compensation for providing or arranging for the provision of services to the Fund, including the issue or allotment of securities.

See *Series Information* for the annual rates paid by each series (as a percentage of average net assets) for these fees.

Securityholders in Series F (formerly Series U) also pay an advisory fee directly to the Distributors. This fee is not included in the Fund's expenses.

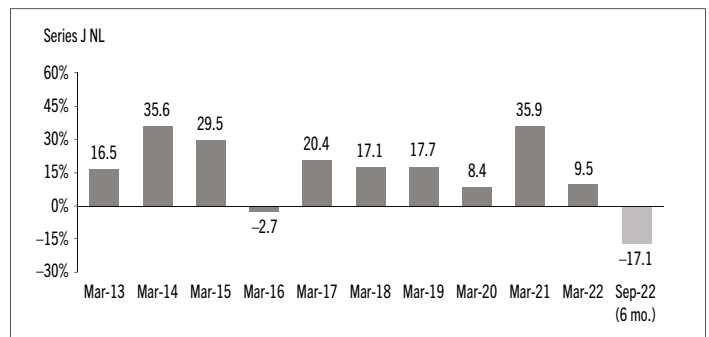
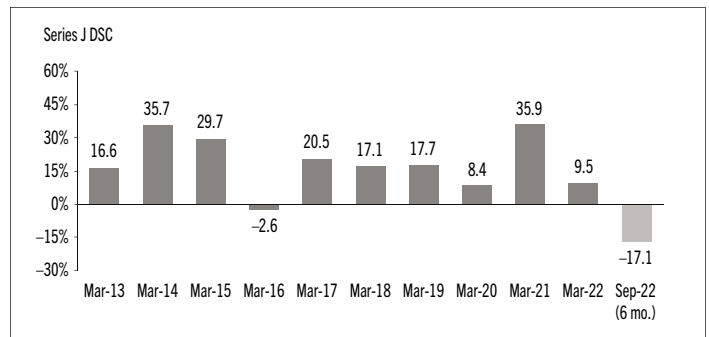
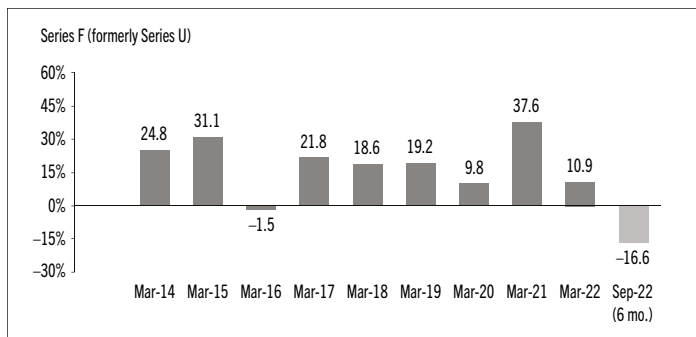
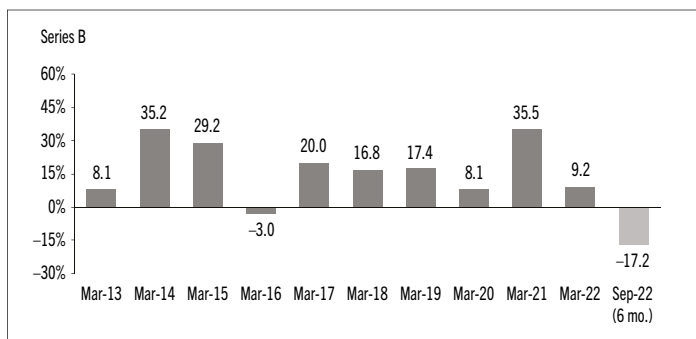
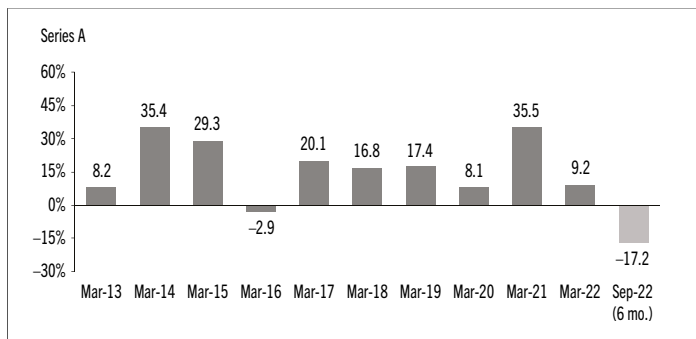
During the period, the Fund invested substantially all of its assets in another IG Wealth Management Fund. There is no duplication of fees incurred by the Fund in connection with these investments.

- (2) Management expense ratio ("MER") is based on total expenses, excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, income taxes and withholding taxes, for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period, except as noted. In the period a series is established, the MER is annualized from the date of inception to the end of the period. Where the Fund directly invests in securities of another fund (including exchange-traded funds or "ETFs"), the MERs presented for the Fund include the portion of MERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment. Any income distributions received from ETFs managed by affiliates of the Manager, with the intention of offsetting fees paid within those ETFs but which are not considered to be duplicative fees under regulatory requirements, are treated as waived expenses for MER purposes. The Manager may waive or absorb operating expenses at its discretion and stop waiving or absorbing such expenses at any time without notice.
- (3) The trading expense ratio ("TER") represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs incurred as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period. Where the Fund invests in securities of another fund (including ETFs), the TERs presented for the Fund include the portion of TERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment.
- (4) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund. The portfolio turnover rate is not provided when the Fund is less than one year old. The value of any trades to realign the Fund's portfolio after a fund merger, if any, is excluded from the portfolio turnover rate.

Management Fees

The Fund pays a management fee, and this fee, paid by each series, is calculated as a percentage of the net asset value of the series at the close of each business day (see *Series Information* for rates payable by each series). Generally, management fees pay the costs incurred to provide investment advisory and management services, as well as distribution-related services provided by the Distributors.

However, in the case of Series F, securityholders pay the Distributor an advisory fee (separate from the management fee) directly. Therefore, the management fee in that series is used for investment advisory and management services only.

For all other retail series (i.e. those that exclude Series R, P and S, if issued), approximately 66% of management fees paid during the period was used for investment advisory and management services, and approximately 34% related to distribution-related services. This may vary by series.
